Minimalist Camping Packing List

Tip: One of the simplest ways to pack for camping is in large, durable storage bins. They are sturdy, protect against weather, and are easy to keep organized. We split this list into "Bins", one for each area of the campsite, and then categories within that Bin. You may need to use more than one bin for each area.

Note: This list is set up for a family of 4 and a trip of at least 3 days.
